A. BACKGROUND

CRS/F2F and IAAS agreed to strengthen the capacity in teaching, learning and research of the faculties involve in higher agriculture education institution. The aim is to equip the human capital required for quality and effective teaching in Nepalese agriculture.

Institute of Agriculture and Animal Science is an academic institution under Tribhuvan University for imparting higher education in agriculture, animal science and veterinary sciences. IAAS which has been operating since 1974 is the pioneer and the largest educational institution in the field of agriculture in Nepal. At present, IAAS has one post graduate (PG) program, four constituent campuses, and four affiliated colleges distributed over different ecological regions of the country. The mission of the institute is to promote agricultural education and to train manpower for the overall development of agriculture. IAAS has also been continuously focusing on research and extension spanning around the problems and needs for agricultural development. In recent years, IAAS offers three levels of academic degrees including B.Sc.Ag., M.Sc.Ag. and PhD in various subjects of agriculture. IAAS hosted about 450 students per year in under-graudate agriculture while only 50 students are enrolled in bachelor in veterinary science annually. More than 100 students have been enrolled in different disciplines of post graduate program every year at IAAS.

B. ISSUE DESCRIPTION

IAAS has been actively engaged in teaching-learning processes and conducting researches. Currently IAAS has ~80 full time teaching faculties representing different spheres of agriculture and animal sciences. Same faculties are heavily engaged in postgraduate teaching and research program. Their main duties are to teach undergraduate and postgraduate students and supervise post-graduate students for their compulsory field work. In addition, the academic faculties of University including both Agriculture and Animal Sciences departments are currently participating in various experiments and researches. The university has restructured is agriculture and animal sciences courses and most of the faculties are young talented people with willingness to learn and teach. These faculty members have come from different Universities in and outside Nepal. Faculty members have wider array of expertise and experiences, which is admirable, but still need to be harmonized to for quality learning environment. There are gaps on new research methodologies, data analysis and its interpretation among faculty members. There is a need to enhance existing academic faculties and senior administrator capacity on teaching and learning practices on topics not limited to; lesson planning, faculties and student evaluation, improvement in internal examination system and classroom management. IAAS believe that strengthening the pedagogical knowledge and skills of the faculties will contribute in development of qualified human capital. IAAS is looking for F2F program volunteer assistance to focus on in-house training and skill development to develop competent IAAS faculties.

C. OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The general objective of this project is to enhance the skills and knowledge of IAAS faculties through various capacity development programs for quality teaching. A week in house training schedule is proposed in table 1.

D. HOST CONTRIBUTION

IAAS will serve as the host institution to select the faculties and manage capacity development program at local level.

E. ANTICIPATED RESULTS FROM THE ASSIGNMENT

Faculties will be trained in particular for effective teaching in agriculture. Trained faculties will add the value in effective teaching to the postgraduate and undergraduate students. Graduated students multiply the effective teaching in their respective field. Hence, National agriculture research, extension and development organization will be benefitted from quality graduates.

H. DESIRABLE VOLUNTEERS SKILLS dummy

This program is designed aiming to develop the capacity of IAAS faculties with current pedagogical knowledge, skills and academic writing. We have a firm belief that academicians working in USA are relatively more familiar with most of the advanced knowledge and technologies used for effective teaching as most of the universities of USA are top ranked university in the global context. Similarly, academician familiar with the agricultural education are more appropriate for the proposed training. Hence, IAAS is expected to involve at least one expert having advance knowledge and skills in pedagogy and academic writing.

I. ACCOMMODATION AND OTHER IN-COUNTRY LOGISTICS

- Before travelling to the assignment place, the volunteer will stay in Kathmandu at one of the CRS's client hotels, Hotel Kutumba <u>https://www.orbitz.com/Lalitpur-Hotels-Hotel-Kutumba.h33780567.Hotel-Information</u> or another hotel that will be booked and confirmed before the arrival date. In Kathmandu, the hotel usually has rooms that include services such as airport pickup and drop-off, breakfast, wireless internet, etc. The hotel or CRS will arrange a vehicle for short travel from the hotel to CRS and vice versa while in Kathmandu.
- All required materials will be prepared ahead of time and will be provided to the volunteer. CRS Nepal will provide the volunteer with a laptop computer (if s/he needs), local internet dongle (modem/EVDO) and mobile phone with charged local SIM-card. Any other required logistics and facilities can also be requested

by the volunteer during her/his stay in Kathmandu. CRS will provide a vehicle and accompany the volunteer to the place of assignment.

- During the assignment period, the volunteer will be booked in a hotel at the project site or guest room provided by host facility, to be confirmed prior to volunteer arrival. CRS Nepal will arrange hotel accommodation and cover the lodging bills against receipts. CRS HQ will provide the volunteer with a perdiem advance to cater meals and incidences.
- Security information will be provided by CRS Nepal Security focal person at Kathmandu CRS Country office.

J. RECOMMENDED ASSIGNMENT PREPARATIONS

- Prior to travel, the volunteer is advised to sufficiently communicate with host focal points to better prepare assignment in advance as it is related to curricula upgrading.
- Go through IAAS existing curricula module and search for other curricula in the US universities what works the best in local context and scenario
- If the volunteer requires use of simple training aids like flip charts, markers or tape s/he should make the request and collect from the CRS office in Kathmandu prior to travel to the assignment place.
- Translation of handouts to the local language can be done at the assignment location if required.
- Depending on the meeting places and availability of electric power and LCD projector, the volunteer may use a laptop and projector for power point presentations.
