1. Assignment Objectives as in SOW

Train farmers in Leadership Skills and Group Dynamics.



2. Achievement of the assignment objectives

We organized three sets of training over six days for three clusters -- so nine farmer groups were trained.

We served 143 farmers total, including a majority of women farmers (80 women, 62 men).



3. Recommendations to the host with regards to the assignment

Recommendations:

- 1- Train board members (3 hours).
- 2- Train additional groups via Peter.
- 3- Introduce community dinners to groups.
- 4- Continue messages for climate change information.
- 5- Continue informational radio outreach.
