What is the IAEFP?


The International Agricultural Education Fellowship Program (IAEFP) is a USDA-funded program that provides opportunities for fellows to assist and support schools in Uganda to establish school-based agricultural education and youth extension programs. Participating schools receive classroom instruction, field demonstrations, entrepreneurship projects, and leadership development expertise provided by the fellows.

- Funds for airfare, housing, stipend, visa, insurance, and travel vaccines.
